Resolution 2018-86 Introduction of 2018 Municipal Budget

Summary will be published in the Asbury Park Press on march 30

The CFO stated the \$5,139,653.38 budget is strong and fiscally responsible. The Borough is paying down debt service and offsetting others from the sale of the old municipal building. Included in the budget is money for police at the school, and police accreditation. The Borough will maintain the same size of staff. \$3,403,047 is the proposed amount to be raised by taxation. The average increase will be \$74 per household based on a \$174,000 average assessment.

Councilman Ross stated there was attendance from the Police Department and First Aid and Fire during budget meetings to meet their needs without adding new funds.
