Mayor Hanshy stated the resolution misrepresents the facts in a partisan manner, using unnecessary, inflammatory and racist language. Every local official is opposed to the cut in funding and a resolution was passed against this cut in funding; in addition to joining you (Sandy Ross) and most of this Governing Body in Trenton to protest these funding cuts.

Councilman Ross stated the resolution was not racist, and accurate in facts. He further stated the Council voted in majority of this Resolution.

**8. OLD BUSINESS**

**2020 Calendar**

Mayor Emeritus Cradle spoke to the Governing Body on the 2020 Calendar. He provided a breakdown of costs related to his service. He stated that his stipend doesn't include the Borough-wide mailing.

Councilman Ross stated they've spoken to residents and believe they are all in favor of keeping the additional garbage pickup during the summer months.

Councilwoman Mosley stated she's spoken to over 70 people, and all were in-favor of an additional pickup.

**Speed Bumps**

Chief Kosh identified locations for placement of temporary speed bumps

The Borough Administrator/Clerk opened the floor for Public Comment

Anna Polozzo, 12 Citadel Ave: Thanked the Governing Body for passing the resolution opposing State Aid Cuts.

Tom Rolhausen, 420 Applegate Ave: Stated that people will throw garage out whether you have one or two, and that it would be a mistake to take away the extra pickup. It's also great the Borough got speed humps, however they may not last.

The Borough Administrator stated they were able to purchase more at this price, and would be used as temporary traffic calming. They can be uninstalled if the street requires paving, or if they need to be moved.

Krista Whitaker, 20 Baylor, stated she thought there has been twice a week pickup since she was 18. She also questioned the 30 item limit on bulk pick up.

Oscar Cradle, 4 Center St.: He stated there are a lot of bar-b-qs in the summer, and doesn't want food hanging around. He believes this is a service that is afforded in taxes.

**9. NEW BUSINESS**

Councilman Murray requested attention to a run-off drain on Attison Avenue.

Councilwoman Mosley stated her interest in starting the Christmas decoration contest. She further stated that next year would be great to also add a Halloween house decoration contest; similar to the Christmas Home decoration contest.

Seeing no further questions or comments, Councilman Murray motioned to adjourn, Council President Taylor seconded, and full Council consent.
